Points to Remember While doing Vastu

 Always Use Scaled Layout Plans: Ensure your building plan is drawn to scale with precise measurements. Accuracy is crucial for correct zone identification and energy assessment.

- Remedies Should Match Symptoms: Apply Vastu remedies only when the observed symptoms clearly align with known Vastu imbalances. Never implement corrections based on assumptions.
- Follow Client Inputs, Not Guesswork: Don't presume or speculate about issues. Listen carefully to the client and assess the space based on their real experiences and concerns.
- List Problems and Prioritize Goals: When working on your own property, start by writing down all the challenges you're facing and the goals you wish to achieve. Then focus on addressing the most critical issue first.
- Avoid Applying All Remedies at Once: Vastu corrections must be implemented gradually. Tackle one problem at a time, in order of importance. This ensures clarity in results and avoids energy confusion.
- Monitor the Impact of Remedies: After applying a remedy, closely observe any changes in the environment, behavior, or results. Every space responds differently, and small shifts can indicate progress.
- Reassess If No Results in 45–60 Days: If there is no noticeable improvement within 1.5 to 2 months, revisit your plan, re-analyze the layout, and adjust the remedy as needed. Vastu is a dynamic process and may require fine-tuning.

4-Step Method for Effective Vastu Solutions

- 1. Entrance checking (32 entries) 3. Five elements checking
- 16 Vastu zones checking
 Vastu remedies for balancing

When analyzing a space, begin by observing the door's location and its impact. Next, assess the placement of rooms within different zones and their effects. The third step involves evaluating the balance of the five elements. Finally, consider space programming—how the space relates to positive or negative events.

To effectively address issues, clearly identify each symptom. Prioritize the most urgent problems based on the observed symptoms, applying solutions according to the outlined steps. Monitor the effects over a few days. As one symptom resolves, others may emerge, which should then be addressed sequentially. This phased approach is crucial for successful treatment. Whether designing new spaces or rectifying existing ones, the focus is either achieving specific goals or resolving existing problems.

So, in all, there are four types of work-areas in Vastu Shastra:

- 1. To solve problems being faced in a built- up structure or a building or a space;
- 2. To achieve some targets in a built-up structure;
- 3. To solve the existing problem while proceeding to build a new structure; and

To build a new building in a manner to enable it to manifest its particular purpose

And in all these four, the correct sequence is very important in Vastu Shastra. Distorting the procedural order won't yield desired results, emphasizing the need for a systematic approach. Importantly, only treat observed symptoms; avoid interventions if no problems exist. Treatment is warranted solely when symptoms perfectly align with known issues. This clarity ensures precise thought and action, leading to accurate outcomes. Vastu Shastra is a science, leaving no room for "maybes." It asserts that specific actions, performed correctly, will unfailingly produce predictable results. Mastery lies in proper practice.

Get To-The-Scale' Building Plan First

Before analysing any space through the systematic 4-Step vastu method, it is very important to make an accurate to-the-scale plan of that space.

A plan drawn to scale is always a good idea as it gives you the exact measurements needed to study the 16 vastu Zones.

Drawing to scale, or creating an exact proportional representation of a particular space is just a matter of careful measurement.

1. Draw a Rough Sketch

- **Sketch the Outer Walls:** Start by drawing the approximate shape of the area's exterior walls on your notepad.
- Measure and Note Walls: Use a measuring tape to get the lengths and widths of all walls, then write these measurements on your sketch.
- Locate Windows and Doors: Measure and mark the positions and widths of all windows and doors.
- Add Fixed Features: Note the dimensions and locations of permanent fixtures like counters, beds, and tables.
- Outline Clearly: Trace your entire sketch in black ink using a ruler for a clear, easy-to-read floor plan.

2. Make a To-The-Scale Plan of the Building

- **Choose a Scale:** Select a scale that fits your room dimensions and graph paper (e.g., 6 inches or 1 foot per square). Ensure easy conversion and that the entire plan fits on one sheet.
- Transfer Walls and Fixtures: Using a pencil and straight edge, accurately transfer the dimensions and locations of walls and built-in fixtures to the graph paper, maintaining your chosen scale.
- Add Windows: Draw an additional line parallel to the wall line, about 1/8 inch outside the room, at the window locations.
- Add Doors: Erase the wall line where the door goes. Draw a
 perpendicular line from the hinge side, the length of the door.
 Connect its end to the wall where the door would rest when
 closed, using a compass rotated from the hinge point.



Reading Directions Accurately from Compass

Understanding how to use a Vastu or magnetic compass is fundamental. The core principle is simple: the compass needle consistently points to the Earth's magnetic North. Given that Vastu demands extreme precision, even accounting for a quarter of a degree, it's highly recommended

that aspiring Vastu experts use an oil-filled compass. The following steps and precautions are essential for accurate readings:

- Positioning the Compass: Stand parallel to a reference wall on the site. Hold the compass's baseplate flat and horizontally at chest level, ensuring the needle floats freely and points to magnetic North. Remember, a compass needle's sole function is to point to magnetic North.
- 2. Aligning for Magnetic North: Rotate the entire compass housing until the needle perfectly aligns within the orienting arrow, typically a red stencil on the compass base. The zero-degree mark on the housing and the North end of the needle should coincide. At this point, the compass is pointing perfectly to magnetic North. Crucially, note that this reading is relative to the wall you're referencing and should be recorded alongside the building's plan.
- 3. Accuracy is Paramount: Learning to take precise compass readings is critical. An error of even five degrees can render your entire calculation inaccurate and lead to failure, potentially miscalculating nearly half an entrance. Therefore, the maximum permissible error limit is a mere one or two degrees.

4. Important Precautions While Using a Compass:

- Avoid Magnetic Interference: Ensure no magnetic objects like mobile phones, laptops, speakers, or any iron items are near the compass, as they can affect the needle's accuracy.
- Beware of Electrical Interference: Confirm there are no overhead or underground electric or telephone cables or wires where you're standing, as these can also interfere with the compass needle.
- Choose an Unobstructed Location: Do not stand under lintels, slabs, or canopies reinforced with iron bars. The best practice is to determine the correct direction by standing outside the building on clear ground and taking multiple readings from different spots on the site.

The Crucial Role of Accurate Directions in Vastu

Accurate directional analysis forms the bedrock of Vastu, influencing energy flow. Unfortunately, this vital aspect is often overlooked or misinterpreted, leading to ineffective "Vastu yantras" and costly, fruitless alterations. Such misapplication causes Vastu to be dismissed as baseless. In reality, Vastu precisely defines 16 Vastu zones, each a 22.5-degree segment of the 360-degree space. Each zone governs a specific life aspect, underscoring the critical importance of precise directional readings for genuine Vastu benefits.

Chapter 2

Effects of the Entrances (32 Entries) and Virtual Entries (11 Entries)

Understanding Entrance Effects in Vastu

The entrance of a space profoundly impacts its energy, whether positively or negatively. To analyze these effects, you need to accurately identify the entrance's location on a scaled floor plan. Vastu employs a unique "Angular Divisions Method": the 360 degrees around a space's center are divided into 32 equal 11.25-degree sections, each representing a potential entrance. This precise approach sets Vastu apart. By noting the space's directions and marking the entrance on your map, you can then match observed symptoms to rectify the ill-effects of a poorly placed entrance.

Pinpointing Your Home's Entrance Location for Vastu Analysis

Accurately identifying your home's entrance on a map is crucial, as its effects are always powerful, whether positive or negative. To analyze these effects, you need to precisely locate the entrance. Begin by taking your house plan and spreading it flat.

Establishing the Center and Axis:

- Outline all the outer walls of your plan.
- Join them to form a basic square or rectangle.
- Draw diagonals connecting the corners. The point where these diagonals intersect is the center point of your space.
- From this center point, draw a dotted perpendicular line; this line

represents the "Axis" of your plan. This axis is vital as it serves as the reference for marking North and other directions.

Determining Directions on Your Plan: You've already learned to take a compass reading. Now, identify one of the walls of your space on the map. Stand facing this wall, keeping the axis in mind.

- Place the compass directly in front of you.
- Observe where the needle points and note down the reading.
- Place a protractor or circle master at the center point of your scaled plan, aligning it with the axis.
- Draw a clear straight line with a color pencil across the plan at the degrees indicated by your compass.
- One side of this line indicates North, and the opposite side is South.

With North and South established, you can find the other cardinal directions:


- East is 90 degrees clockwise from North (to your right when facing North from the center).
- South is 90 degrees clockwise from East.
- West is 90 degrees clockwise from South.
- North is 90 degrees clockwise from West.

Dividing the Space into 32 Entrance Segments: Starting from North, divide the 360-degree circle into 32 parts.

- Mark NE at 45 degrees from North, then SE at another 45 degrees, followed by SW and NW.
- Now, divide each 45-degree segment into four equal parts, each measuring 11.25 degrees. Most building entrances will fall within one of these segments.
- Mark the segments between NE and SE as E1, E2, up to E8.

• Similarly, mark segments between SE and SW as S1 to S8; between SW and NW as W1 to W8; and between NW and NE as N1 to N8.

This method reveals the location of 32 possible entrances to a building. Of these, only nine are considered highly beneficial. Once you've precisely calculated these entrance locations according to Vastu, you can accurately match your building's symptoms with their corresponding Vastu effects.



Understanding the 32 Vastu Entrances and Their Effects

Vastu Shastra delineates 32 potential entrance points for any structure, each carrying distinct positive or negative impacts on its occupants' lives. These entrances are categorized by direction, with specific effects associated with each.

North Entrances (N1 - N8)

North-facing plots feature eight entrances, with three considered positive and the rest negative:

- **N1 (Negative):** Increases the likelihood of tragic events like murder and instills unnecessary fears in residents.
- **N2** (**Negative**): Fosters jealousy among residents and creates animosity from external individuals.
- **N3 (Positive):** Brings abundant wealth and tends to result in more male offspring.
- **N4 (Positive):** Grants significant inherited property.
- **N5 (Neutral):** Neither positive nor negative; it cultivates a religious inclination in residents.
- **N6 (Negative):** Causes excessive anxiety and promotes rude behavior among inhabitants.
- **N7 (Negative):** Particularly detrimental for girls, leading them to defy family traditions.
- N8 (Positive): Highly beneficial for organizations and companies dealing with banks, leading to increased bank balances for occupants.

East Entrances (E1 - E8)

East-facing plots also have eight entrances, but only two are considered positive:

- **E1 (Negative):** Leads to financial losses and increased risk of accidents
- **E2 (Negative):** Results in higher expenses and a tendency for more female births.
- E3 (Positive): Brings money, profits, and overall success.
- **E4 (Positive):** Attracts beneficial gains and support from influential people.

- E5 (Negative): Makes residents aggressive.
- **E6** (**Negative**): Causes occupants to fail on their commitments.
- **E7** (Negative): Renders residents insensitive.
- **E8 (Negative):** Associated with accidents, financial losses, and theft.

South Entrances (S1 - S8)

South-facing plots have eight possible entrances, with two considered positive:

- **\$1 (Negative):** Creates negative effects for male children, drawing them toward undesirable company.
- **S2** (**Positive**): Beneficial for those in MNCs, promoting career growth, regular promotions, and salary hikes.
- **S3 (Positive):** Brings money and success, allowing residents to earn wealth through their reputation and goodwill.
- **S4 (Positive):** Generates wealth through fame, making it ideal for actors and media professionals.
- **S5 (Negative):** Leads to debts and financial losses.
- **S6 (Negative):** The most negative entrance, causing poverty as it's located in the direction of disposal.
- **S7 (Negative):** Results in wasted efforts.
- **S8** (**Negative**): Makes residents feel lonely and isolated, disconnecting them from the world.

West Entrances (W1 - W8)

West-facing plots also feature eight entrances, with two deemed positive:

- **W1 (Negative):** Leads to poor financial conditions and a reduced lifespan, with a higher risk of early demise (around 35-40 years old).
- **W2 (Negative):** Causes insecurity, leading to relationship problems and an unstable career.

- **W3 (Positive):** Auspicious, bringing money, growth, and prosperity.
- W4 (Positive): Fills residents' lives with happiness.
- **W5** (**Negative**): Fosters an over-ambitious attitude where inhabitants demand high value for low-quality products/services.
- **W6 (Negative):** Leads to unfulfilled expectations for residents.
- **W7 (Negative):** Makes inhabitants unhappy and prone to drug addiction.
- **W8 (Negative):** Encourages selfish behavior among residents.

It's tough for everyone to get a house with their ideal entrance. While some might have the option to renovate for a better entrance, many don't, especially those in rental homes or cases where renovation isn't feasible for a good entrance.

In these situations, you can balance the existing entrances by using color or metal strips. Another effective method is to paint the main door with a balancing color that corresponds to its direction.


ENTRANCE BLOCKING BY TAPE/ COLOUR



ENTRANCE BLOCKING BY METAL STRIP



Powers of the 16 vastu zones



Evaluating Effects of Room Locations: Marking the 16 Vastu Zones

To assess the impact of room placement, you'll need to mark the 16 Vastu Zones on your plan.

Starting with North as your reference point:

- Measure 11.25 degrees to the left (counter-clockwise) and 11.25 degrees to the right (clockwise) from North. This 22.5-degree segment defines the North zone.
- The subsequent 22.5-degree segment, moving clockwise, is the North of North-East zone (NNE).
- Following that, the next 22.5-degree segment is the North-East zone (NE), and so on.

By continuing this precise division around the entire 360-degree space, you will identify all 16 Vastu zones. These zones are crucial for understanding the energetic implications of different room placements within your space.

Through this division, we arrive at 16 Vastu zones, namely:

North (N) South (S)

North of North-East (NNE)

South of South West (SSW)

North-East (NE) South West (SW)

East of North-East (ENE) West of South West (WSW)

East (E) West (W)

East of South East (ESE) West of North West (WNW)

South East (SE) North West (NW)

South of South East (SSE)

North of North West (NNW)

The North Zone: Money and Opportunities in Vastu

The North direction is crucial for attracting money and opportunities,

as it's governed by Lord Kubera, the deity of wealth and treasure. A balanced North zone brings money and prosperity to residents.

This direction provides the transformative power to convert your products and services into wealth. While liquid cash is associated with the Southeast, the path to it originates from the North.

The North-Northwest (NNW) zone is vital for attracting clients seeking your offerings. When balanced, NNW also promotes health and solutions, ensuring smooth transactions to convert your "treasures" (products/services) into money.

Since North belongs to the water element, avoid placing fire or earth elements here, such as red or yellow colors, kitchens, toilets, or dustbins, as they create imbalances.

North-North-East (NNE): Health and Immunity

The North-North-East (NNE) zone, formed by North (treasures/money) and North-East (ideas/vision), governs health and solutions. It's an ideal location for medicines, signifying a system free of blockages. A balanced NNE indicates clear vision for converting efforts into success. Imbalances here, caused by elements like toilets, inverters, fireplaces, red colors, or junk, lead to severe health issues such as low immunity and chronic diseases. Disruptions in NNE also affect the North and North-East zones. This area is perfect for a relaxing lounge or a doctor's consulting room.

North-East (NE): Mind Clarity and Vision

The North-East (NE) direction governs ideas and vision, which originate from our subconscious. For these ideas to manifest, our conscious mind must be receptive. NE is a combination of NNE (solutions) and ENE (creativity). A balanced NNE ensures a mind free from blockages, making it receptive to new ideas. When ENE is balanced, these subconscious ideas become creative and lead to smooth problem-solving.

The North-East is ideal for a meditation or puja room. Just as entering a temple naturally puts your mind in a receptive state, having a puja room here makes residents more open to receiving insights for life's purpose and desires. It's not strictly necessary to meditate daily in this direction; simply placing a revered deity's picture in the NE can strengthen your divine connection and aid in fulfilling your life's purpose.

Conversely, placing a temple in other directions can have different effects. For instance, a temple in the East-South-East (ESE), the direction of analysis, might lead to overthinking and difficulty making decisions. If a temple is in the South-South-West (SSW), the direction of disposal, it can sever your connection with divine energies, making you feel completely disconnected.

East-North-East (ENE): Fun and Recreation

The East-North-East (ENE) direction governs creativity and joy in all aspects of life. When you feel joyful and create products or services with enthusiasm, they attract global attention. ENE energies help you craft the best offerings and are ideal for recreation, making it a suitable location for a bathing area.

Composed of North-East (ideas/vision) and East (social circle/marketing), a balanced ENE fosters creative ideas and a state of happiness. This joy helps you connect easily with the external world. ENE also provides freshness; if you feel stuck or lack newness in life, check your home's ENE zone. Clutter and old storage disrupt this area. Placing multicolored flowers in a green pot in ENE can restore freshness and lost creativity.

East (E): Social Networking and Connections

The East direction profoundly influences your social circle, encompassing clients, neighbors, and siblings. Building connections with the right people is crucial for fulfilling your life's purpose. This direction is ideal for a drawing room at home or a meeting/conference room in an office.

East is formed by the East-North-East (ENE), governing creativity and joy, and East-South-East (ESE), which facilitates analysis. When you're in a joyful state (ENE), you naturally attract external connections. Through discussions and analysis (ESE), you discern who to collaborate with to achieve your goals, fostering a strong social network. Choosing supportive individuals brings immense joy and fulfillment.

Consider customers who purchase your products or services at your set price; they are influenced by the East direction. Politicians rely on strong connections with the masses, also governed by East, to win elections. E-commerce platforms, too, need robust public connections, nurtured by the East direction, to boost sales.

An imbalance in the East direction can make individuals introverted, hindering their ability to express themselves and form necessary connections for business or personal growth. A toilet in the East can completely disconnect you from the world. Conversely, keeping green plants in the East strengthens its energies, helping you build a thriving social circle.

East-South-East (ESE): Analysis and Churning

The East-South-East (ESE) direction grants the ability to analyze various options and make optimal decisions. It represents the power of "churning," much like the ancient Indian story of ocean churning that produced valuable gems, including the Goddess Laxmi (wealth), Amrit (longevity), and Vish (venom). Controlled churning yields beneficial outcomes like Amrit, while excessive churning leads to negative results (Vish), and no churning produces nothing.

For effective decision-making, controlled churning is essential. Overthinking can cause confusion. As the next zone is Southeast (fire and liquid cash), ESE is ideal for a kitchen or placing a mixer/grinder.

However, an ESE bedroom is problematic. Sleeping here can cause excessive overthinking about minor issues, leading to frequent family arguments. Case studies have shown resolving marital disputes by simply relocating beds from ESE.

South-East (SE): The Zone of Cash Flow and Spark

The Southeast (SE) direction, also known as Agni Kon or the corner of fire, is vital for liquid cash flow. It provides the necessary spark to execute decisions made through the churning process of the East-South-East zone.

Beyond finances, Southeast governs the look, feel, and beauty of everything, including your products and services. The initial impression of your offerings, their aesthetic appeal, is crucial for attracting customers. Just as some individuals possess an inherent spark or aura despite their physical appearance, a balanced fire element in a home contributes to a compelling presence. Fire manifests in two forms: literal flames and the metaphorical spark or sense of security in one's life.

Fire is considered highly auspicious, being associated with Goddess Laxmi, who is depicted in red, the color of fire. This is why many Hindu rituals, such as lighting diyas or performing havans, begin with the initiation of fire.

An imbalanced Southeast in any building can lead to cash shortages and frequent accidents. It also causes delays or hurdles in auspicious life events like marriages or childbirth. The presence of blue color (representing water, which extinguishes fire) in the Southeast can result in severe cash crunch and a lack of security.

Furthermore, government departments like Income Tax and Customs are associated with the fire element. If the fire element is weak in a building (home or office), it can attract scrutiny from these departments, leading to financial losses for the inhabitants. The South-South-East (SSE) direction, governing confidence, is adjacent to Southeast. An imbalanced Southeast can, therefore, also lead to a lack of confidence, hindering the initiation of any process.

If you're experiencing any of these issues, lighting a 15-watt red bulb in the Southeast direction can help balance its energies and invite the positive aspects of fire into your life.

South-South-East (SSE): Power and Confidence

The South-South-East (SSE) direction governs the confidence and power needed to initiate and sustain any process, from new businesses to career changes or product investments. While the Southeast sparks initiation, SSE provides the endurance to see tasks through to completion.

At a physical level, SSE provides energy, strength, and zeal. Vastu defects here can cause lethargy and low energy, even in healthy individuals. Mentally, a disturbed SSE leads to a lack of confidence in completing tasks. While North-North-East (NNE) handles general health, an imbalanced SSE specifically impacts energy levels, not necessarily causing disease. SSE is suitable for a bedroom at home to foster a strong personality. In offices, it's ideal for staff who need to work long hours, as SSE provides the necessary power and drive.

South (S): Name, Fame, and Recognition

The South direction is associated with relaxation, fame, and brand building for individuals and organizations. It's the ideal direction for a bedroom, as sleep provides deep relaxation. It's also suitable for meditation, promoting tranquility for both mind and body.

This direction governs the fame and brand recognition you gain from your products and services. To achieve market prominence, the energies of the South must be strong. Vastu defects in this zone can hinder brand building, leading to a lack of buyer trust and reduced demand for your offerings.

Observing famous, relaxed individuals reveals a sense of calm around them. Visiting their homes often instills automatic peace, a result of a balanced South direction in their living spaces.

Conversely, Vastu defects in the South can cause problems like sleep disorders, insomnia, and restlessness. South is formed by SSE (confidence)

and SSW (let go). Confidence in execution brings relaxation. Achieving peace of mind requires releasing negative thoughts, which is facilitated by the SSW direction. Thus, balancing adjacent directions is crucial for a harmonious South.

A toilet in the South can severely damage your product's brand reputation and your image among neighbors. Similarly, the presence of blue color in the South disrupts the inherent fire element, creating imbalance.

South-South-West (SSW): Waste and Disposal

The South-South-West (SSW) direction governs the energies of disposal and the power of letting go in a building. It's essential to eliminate unnecessary things and negative energies from your life to overcome problems. However, disposal must be controlled; imbalances, whether excessive or insufficient, can affect both body and mind.

At a physical level, improper waste disposal can lead to constipation and hinder daily tasks. Conversely, excessive disposal can cause sickness, diarrhea, and fatigue, impacting mental function. Therefore, balanced disposal is crucial for both physical and mental well-being.

Mentally, if negative or useless thoughts aren't disposed of, new ideas face blockages. Too much mental disposal, however, can lead to missing new ideas and forgetting routine tasks, negatively affecting performance.

Given its nature, the SSW direction is ideal for toilets, septic tanks, or dustbins, as these activities align with its disposal energies, ensuring a balanced process.

SSW lies between South (peace) and South-West (relations). Vastu defects in SSW can prevent the release of negative thoughts, leading to a lack of peace. In my observations, prolonged storage of clutter or waste in SSW often causes inhabitants to hold grudges, resulting in family clashes and conflicts.

South-West (SW): Skills, Relationships, and Stability

The South-West (SW) direction, also known as Pitrasthan (place of ancestors), holds significant influence over relationships, stability, and skills. At home, it governs family bonding; in the office, it dictates client relationships. Our ancestors are paramount, and their blessings are essential for personal growth, as they are the source of our existence and inherent talents. The quality of our skills directly translates into the financial abundance we receive.

Historically, artisans stored their tools and warriors kept their weapons in the Southwest to enhance their craft and fighting abilities. In contemporary life, this direction is ideal for placing reference materials or tools used in your work. It's also an excellent location for a quality control department in factories.

Relationships are also a key aspect governed by SW, requiring skill and effort to maintain. Disputes often stem from Vastu defects in this direction. To strengthen family bonds, it's recommended to place family photographs in golden frames in the Southwest. However, avoid placing photographs of siblings or cousins here, as it can lead to their increased interference in personal family matters.

The Southwest is diametrically opposite to the North-East (NE). While the NE, where deities reside, provides insights for growth, the SW governs the skills and art required to execute those insights. Due to this opposition, Vastu Shastra advises against worshipping ancestors or placing their photographs in the North-East. Similarly, temples or images of gods/goddesses should not be placed in the Southwest.

The SW zone is composed of South-South-West (SSW - let go) and West-South-West (WSW - education/practice). West-South-West (WSW): Education and Savings

WSW is the direction of "Vidya Abhyas"—the continuous practice and retention of talents and skills.

This zone is ideal for a study or dining area, or for placing a fridge, as its energies promote preservation. When a child's study table is in WSW, it ensures good retention, helping them recall studies in exams. If a child forgets everything in exams despite studying, check for a toilet in WSW, as its disposal energies can negate learning.

A dining area in WSW helps the body retain food nutrients. Similarly, a fridge placed here aligns with its preservation qualities.

WSW is also the perfect place for keeping savings, including extra cash, jewelry, and property papers. If you're facing property disputes, storing relevant papers and hanging a black-framed village scene picture in WSW can help protect your assets.

This direction is also suitable for a children's room, as it fosters knowledge acquisition crucial for their development and future success. Your home reflects your subconscious mind, so items placed in WSW yield specific results. A TV here might distract a child from studying, while toys could encourage play instead of academics. Crucially, a toilet or washing machine in WSW can severely impair a child's ability to retain what they study, no matter how hard they try.

WSW is composed of South-West (skills) and West (gains). Vastu defects in WSW can hinder proper skill practice due to a lack of knowledge, thereby impacting your financial gains.

West (W): Gains and Profits

The West zone is directly linked to material gains and profits, ensuring your efforts yield positive outcomes like money, growth, knowledge, or achievements. This energy prevents your hard work from going to waste, providing the drive to work tirelessly and efficiently. Unlike the South-Southeast's internal strengthening tonic effect, this zone's energy is like essential sustenance for achievement.

The West zone is crucial for fulfilling desires. An extended West zone won't necessarily increase gains, but rather inflate expectations, as true fulfillment comes from balance. Conversely, a cut or small West zone leads to unfulfilled desires, results below expectations, and wasted effort. Balanced energies in this zone bring contentment to mind, body, and spirit, paving the way for happiness.

A toilet here negates all gains. A bedroom in the West promotes easy profit flow, while a drawing room ensures fruitful meetings. This zone's energy profoundly influences any activity undertaken within it.

West-North-West (WNW): Stress and Depression

The West-North-West (WNW) direction holds energies for detoxification, primarily at a mental level, making it ideal for a bathing area. This differs from SSW (disposal), which focuses more on physical waste.

In states of depression, individuals often feel useless or despairing, leading to urges to cry or self-harm. Crying, even from happiness, releases negative emotions and brings relief. When the WNW direction is balanced, you naturally release daily emotional and mental stress. However, Vastu defects here can prevent your subconscious from releasing mental blockages, causing suffocation and depression, hindering enjoyment of life.

A storeroom in WNW can accumulate negative thoughts in residents' minds, leading to persistent regrets about the past. Conversely, a kitchen (fire element) in this direction can burn away negative and useless thoughts, leaving occupants feeling fresh and liberated.

WNW is a blend of West (gains) and Northwest (support). A lack of gains or unfulfilled desires can lead to depression. Conversely, achieving gains and desires brings joy. Similarly, strong support from family and friends fosters a positive mindset, while its absence can cause depression. Therefore, balancing the energies in all directions is crucial for a happy and prosperous life.

North-West (NW): Banking and Support Systems

The North-West (NW) direction governs the entire support system in your life. Historically, it was used for storing essential food grains, ensuring availability when needed. In modern times, this translates to various forms of support, including financial aid from banks, raw material suppliers, labor, and buyers who keep money flowing within industries.

Conversely, a drawing room or meeting room in the Northwest can lead to favorable meeting outcomes and deals that align with your terms. A bedroom in this direction fosters a helpful nature in you, and ensures you receive support from others whenever required.

This direction is also ideal for placing a picture of your Kuldevta or Kuldevi (family deity). Just as Southwest governs ancestors and Northeast

governs deities, Northwest oversees your family deity, who provides all the support you receive in life.

The energies of the Northwest are a blend of WNW (detoxification) and NNW (attraction). By detoxifying negative past memories (WNW), you can live and enjoy your present. This, in turn, enables you to attract and connect with supportive individuals in your life (NNW) who will assist you whenever you need them.

North-North-West (NNW): Sex and Attraction

The North-North-West (NNW) direction, governed by Goddess Rati, is ideal for sexual pleasure and intimacy for married couples. Its energies draw attention to anything placed there, making it suitable for a marriageable child's bedroom to attract a life partner.

NNW influences both mind and body. Attraction originates in the mind, compelling the body to possess the desired object. This "force" is generated by NNW. Consequently, NNW is excellent for displaying sample racks or saleable products in shops or offices, as it draws customer attention and desire.

Composed of North-West (support/storage) and North (treasure/opportunities), NNW indicates that the quality of your stock and offerings determines customer attraction.




Influence of the Five Elements and its Management Chart

The Five Elements (Panchtatva) in Vastu Shastra

The universe, including all forms of life, is composed of five fundamental elements: Air, Water, Fire, Space, and Earth, collectively known as Panchtatva. These elements form the bedrock of ancient sciences like astrology, Ayurveda, and Vastu Shastra.

In Vastu, the 16 directions of a space are intrinsically linked to these elements.

Vastu Shastra is a precise science, advocating belief only in what you can see, feel, or experience. To manifest desires, one must release past conditionings and experience life authentically, which initiates the creative process. Understanding the five elements is key to experiencing the world, as each element is associated with one of the five human senses (e.g., Water with taste, Air with touch). Balancing these elements within a building can even help control these senses.


The five elements operate in cycles of creation, destruction, and balance.

- Creation Cycle: Water fosters Air (plants), Air fuels Fire, Fire produces Earth (ashes), Earth creates Space (metals), and Space, when melted, forms Water.
- Destruction Cycle: Water extinguishes Fire, Fire destroys Space (melts metals), Space cuts Air (metal cuts wood), Air destroys Earth (trees break ground), and Earth blocks Water.

This continuous cycle governs creation and destruction throughout the universe. Understanding these detailed elemental relationships within directions is fundamental to applying Vastu principles effectively.

Water

The Water element is linked to the directions of North-North-West (attraction), North (opportunities), North-North-East (healing), and North-East (clarity).


A balanced Water element in a building bestows residents with appealing personalities, new financial opportunities, strong immunity, and clear insights for life's purpose and desires. Conversely, an imbalanced Water element leads to a lack of opportunities, weakened immunity, frequent illness, and a lack of clarity in life's direction.

In the elemental cycle, Water is the creator of Air (nurturing plants). It destroys Fire and is blocked by Earth. Water is created when metal is heated to a liquid state.

The inherent nature of Water is flow, encompassing mental thoughts, new opportunities, insights for growth, and positive energy for healing and immunity. Associated with the sense of taste, a balanced Water element is crucial for businesses in the food industry (restaurants, bakeries, etc.) to attract customers and ensure customer satisfaction, thereby facilitating growth.

Understanding the Air Element in Vastu

The Air element follows Water in the elemental sequence and is fundamental for life's survival. Its associated color is green, and its primary shape is a rectangle. Interestingly, an oval shape is also considered to embody the Air element, even if composed of water. This



is because when wavy (water) shapes gain edges, they transform into Air. Conversely, the sharp edges of a rectangle mark the initiation of the Fire element.

The Air Element in Vastu


The Air element is linked to East-North-East (joy/refreshment), East (social connections), and East-South-East (analysis/churning).

A balanced Air element grants the freedom to explore new avenues for growth, enables selection of beneficial insights, and fosters connections with supportive individuals. Conversely, an imbalanced Air element leads to feeling stuck, difficulty making decisions, and disputes with neighbors over minor issues.

Associated with the sense of hearing, a balanced Air element is crucial for those in the music industry or manufacturing hearing aids. Air's influence can transform, as seen in how rock music can energize, converting Air energy into Fire for relaxation or invigoration.

The Fire Element in Vastu

Following Air in the elemental sequence, Fire is the element that ignites life with spark and zeal. It's the source of money, security, confidence, peace, and relaxation, acting as the driving force behind all physical activities. The color



associated with Fire is red, and its characteristic shape is a triangle.

The Fire element is associated with the South-East (money), South-South-East (confidence), and South (peace) directions. A balanced Fire element brings abundant cash, unwavering confidence, and the ability to pursue goals with calmness and relaxation.

Conversely, an imbalanced Fire element leads to blocked payments, insecurity, departmental issues, lack of confidence and zeal, lethargy, and insomnia. It also creates obstacles in auspicious life events like marriage or childbirth and can cause stomach-related health problems.

Fire is linked to the sense of vision and holds a strong attractive quality, akin to Venus in astrology, whose gemstone is diamond. Industries where products sell based on their appearance—like jewelry, clothing, or interior design—greatly benefit from a balanced Fire element in their spaces. Finally, Fire creates the Earth element, as burning leaves behind ashes.

Earth

Following Fire, the Earth element signifies stability and anything stable or heavy. Its color is yellow, and its shape is square. Earth's "weight" can refer to physical objects or an individual's importance due to knowledge, skills, or social standing.



The Earth element manifests as stability in all aspects of life. Its dominance can even be observed in a person's speech, reflecting their core energetic balance (e.g., Amitabh Bachchan's grounded speech). By analyzing speech, you can identify your dominant element and energize its corresponding Vastu directions for better results.

The directions associated with Earth are South-West (skills and stability) and South-South-West (let go and expenditure). A balanced Earth element brings stability in career, business, and relationships, constant growth, and the ability to release negativity, turning expenses into investments. Conversely, an imbalanced Earth element causes insecurity in job and

relationships, frequent conflicts, and increased wasteful expenditure, leading to overall life instability.

Space

Following Earth, the Space element emerges directly from it. Its fundamental nature is expansion. Visually, the vast expanse of the sky embodies this element. In Vastu, the Space element grants expansion in all areas of your life, including career, financial gains,



knowledge, and relationships. The colors associated with Space are grey or white, and its characteristic shape is a circle (round).

The Space element, originating from Mother Earth, is fundamental to manifesting desires and promoting expansion in all life domains. Vastu Shastra is precisely the science of defining areas within space to facilitate this manifestation.

The directions associated with Space are West-North-West (detoxification/depression), West (gains/expansion), and North-West (support).

When Space is balanced in a building, residents experience emotional equilibrium, fulfilled desires, material gains, and consistent support in their career and home life. This fosters a winning attitude and drives business or career expansion.

Conversely, an imbalanced Space element leads to feelings of being stuck, depression, lack of material gains, and emotional and mental imbalance. To overcome these issues, balancing your space according to Vastu principles can unlock growth and prosperity.

Imbalanced Space

An imbalanced Space element obscures wisdom, making you feel your skills are lost and efforts unrewarded. If you're unable to effect positive change and constantly feel stuck and unclear, restoring balance and harmony to your space is crucial. This re-establishes the fundamental

connection to the Panchtatva (five elements) that create our physical reality, leading us to the Theory of Creation.

Theory of Creation


Water creates Wood: Wood creates Fire; Fire creates Earth; the Earth creates Space; and Space again creates Water.

The Cycle of Control illustrates how elements manage each other: Water controls Fire, Fire controls Space (Metal), Metal cuts Wood, Wood separates Earth, and Earth blocks Water. This differs from the Cycle of Creation by focusing on suppression rather than generation. In reality, creation and control occur simultaneously, reflecting life's constant flux. Amidst these opposing forces, we exist in a continuous "Cycle of Balance," representing our constant state of equilibrium.

Theory of Balance

When Creation and Control cycles combine, a dynamic balance emerges. Water creates Wood while controlling Fire. Air creates Fire while separating Earth. Fire melts Space and creates Earth. Earth blocks Water and creates Space, yet is separated by Wood. This constant interplay maintains equilibrium.



Every element, at any given moment, undergoes four simultaneous phases. Consider Water: it's created by Space, in turn creating Air (wood). Simultaneously, it's blocked by Earth and controls Fire. Understanding these parallel actions across all five elements clarifies how everything in life functions.

Colours Full of Life Force

Green, blue, and bluish-green are colors that stimulate the brain, enhancing positive thinking and creativity. When applied in the North-North-East (NNE) Vastu zone, they connect you to energies that inspire positive thoughts and fun. Used in the East-North-East (ENE) zone, these colors refresh both mind and soul, making them ideal for schools and businesses.



The Vastu Bar Chart is a visual tool that easily identifies a building's cut, extended, and balanced Vastu zones through varying bar heights and three horizontal balance lines (lower, proper, upper).

- Extended Zone: A bar higher than the upper balance line signifies an extended, imbalanced zone that needs to be exhausted to regain strength.
- 2. **Cut/Weak Zone:** A bar lower than the lower balance line indicates a cut or weak, imbalanced zone requiring extension or enhancement to strengthen it.
- Programming Zone: Bars falling between the upper and lower balance lines represent balanced zones that need programming to achieve desired outcomes.

Both exhausting and enhancing Vastu zones are performed by applying the Theory of Five Elements.

Vastu Remedies for Cut and Extended Zones: A Comprehensive Guide

In Vastu, imbalances in a building's zones, whether due to a "cut" (weakness) or "extension" (excess), significantly impact the inhabitants'

lives. These can be rectified by applying specific elemental remedies, often involving colors, objects, or minor structural adjustments. The goal is always to restore balance and harmony.

North (N) - Water Element

- Cut: Inhabitants lack new opportunities and struggle to sell products/ services.
 - Treatment: Use blue or white colors.
- **Extended:** Inhabitants receive new opportunities but fail to convert them.
 - Treatment: Use green color.

North-North-East (NNE) - Water Element

- **Cut:** Inhabitants experience low immunity, frequent illness, and difficulty concentrating.
 - **Treatment:** Apply blue or white colors.
- **Extended:** Inhabitants become excessively health-conscious, neglecting other life aspects.
 - **Treatment:** Use green color.

North-East (NE) - Water & Earth Elements (Cardinal)

- **Cut:** Inhabitants lack clarity and new insights for growth, hindering their thinking and ability to plan for future goals.
 - **Treatment:** Use off-white color or a pyramid to enhance positive energies.
- **Extended:** Inhabitants are overwhelmed by too many insights, leading to confusion in decision-making.
 - **Treatment:** Balance with off-white color or use metal strips to symbolically reduce the area.

East-North-East (ENE) - Air Element

- **Cut:** Inhabitants feel bored, suffocated, and lack joy/happiness, even with access to entertainment; they feel stuck.
 - Treatment: Apply blue or green colors.
- Extended: Inhabitants seek excessive enjoyment, harming professional life and diverting time to leisure.
 - Treatment: Use pink color (from the Fire element family), but avoid red.

East (E) - Air Element

- **Cut:** Inhabitants struggle to form or maintain beneficial social or client connections, often feeling exploited.
 - Treatment: Use blue or green colors.

 - Treatment: Use off-white color.

West-South-West (WSW) - Space Element

 - **Treatment:** Use yellow or white color, or White plastic Pyramids.
- **Extended:** Inhabitants acquire useless knowledge, hindering skill application and leading them astray.
 - Treatment: Use blue color.

West (W) - Space Element

- **Cut:** Inhabitants struggle to acquire material gains and sufficient resources for desire fulfillment, including property acquisition.
 - **Treatment:** Use yellow or white color, or White plastic Pyramid.

 - Treatment: Use blue color.

West-North-West (WNW) - Space Element

 - Treatment: Use blue color.

North-West (NW) - Space, Earth, and Water Elements

 - Treatment: Use off-white color, or place White Horses in the Northwest.
- **Extended:** Inhabitants either receive excessive support, making them dependent, or support is delayed when most needed. Also welcomes departmental problems.
 - Treatment: Use blue or off-white color.

North-North-West (NNW) - Water Element

- **Cut:** Inhabitants experience unsatisfactory sexual lives, lack intimacy, leading to irritation and arguments. Products/services lack attraction, resulting in low sales.
 - Treatment: Use blue or white color.
- **Extended:** Couples are physically/sexually unsatisfied, with an excessive urge for intimacy leading to irritation and fights. Products are attractive but perceived as too expensive, hindering sales.
 - Treatment: Use green color.

Programming Balanced Zones and Understanding Zonal Interplay

Once imbalanced zones are treated, balanced zones should be "programmed." This involves placing specific objects and performing activities within these zones to generate desired subconscious emotions. For example, a toilet in the SE zone severely disrupts its balance; such forbidden activities must cease, replaced by conducive activities.

It's crucial to understand that the total energy within an enclosed space is constant. An overactive zone depletes energy from others, leading to problems from both excessive and suppressed energies. For instance, while a balanced North (money flow) ensures smooth finances, an overactive North can make residents desperate for money. Similarly, a suppressed Southwest (relations) causes relationship issues, while an over-extended Southwest leads to demanding and possessive behaviors, exacerbating problems.



Chapter 7

Rooms Allocation as per Vastu

Every zone in your home holds specific energies. When rooms like kitchens, bedrooms, or even toilets are in suitable zones, they create opportunities. Conversely, an unsuitable placement can lead to significant obstacles, so strategic room placement is key to a beneficial home.

Ideal Zone for Puja Place/Puja Room

To connect with inner-self and Universal Consciousness, Hindu seers recognized that Devtas (Gods), representing various powers, are best worshipped in specific locations. They understood that natural elements like plants, stones, and rivers possess inherent Shakti (power). All of them can be broadly divided into 16 categories, as specified in the table below.

Ideal Puja Locations in Vastu Zones

Different Vastu zones are suited for specific types of worship, aligning with their inherent energies and resulting in beneficial outcomes.

- NE (North-East): The ideal zone for general puja and prayer, fostering mental clarity, divine guidance, and overall blessings for the building.
- ENE (East-North-East): While not for formal puja, this zone helps cope with stress, promoting freshness and renewed energy.
- **EAST (E):** Beneficial for politicians and bureaucrats, as puja here can secure favors from officials.
- ESE (East-South-East): Generally not recommended for puja, as
 it causes restlessness and anxiety. An exception is for stockbrokers,
 where it aids wise investments.
- **SE (South-East):** Only Ma Durga's puja is suitable. Other forms of worship can lead to accidents and fear of financial loss.
- **SSE (South-South-East):** Hanumanji's puja here grants power, strength, and confidence. Other pujas are less effective.
- **SOUTH (S):** Best for Ma Kali's puja and ideal for deep, relaxed meditation. Other pujas are ineffective.
- **SSW** (**South-South-West**): All pujas, except for Aghori-type practices, must be strictly avoided, as they invite losses.
- **SW (South-West):** Puja here can slow payment recoveries and hinder financial growth. Vishwakarma puja is an exception, enhancing workers' skills. Pitra puja (ancestral worship) is ideal.

Kapha maintains body resistance, associated with thoughtful, calm individuals. It's responsible for body building, growth, and cell creation. Balancing Kapha involves gentle exercise, stimulating activities, and increased fluid intake.

Know what your prominent dosha is?

Each person possesses a unique combination of three doshas (Vata, Pitta, Kapha) that shape their inherent physical and personality traits. These can shift with physical, mental, and emotional states. Understanding your prominent dosha, and tailoring your lifestyle accordingly, is key to balance and well-being. There are seven body types, each with advantages and disadvantages.

How to Balance Kapha?

To balance Kapha, focus on a light, low-fat diet with bitter, pungent, and astringent tastes. Include raw vegetables, ripe fruits, rye, oats, millet, barley, honey, and spices like pepper, cardamom, cloves, mustard, and turmeric. Limit fats, milk, and rice.





Chapter 16

45 Devtas of Vastu

How Energy Fields Develop During Construction

Whenever any enclosed space, like a house, office, or even a simple image, is created, energy fields form within it. These fields, perceptible through practices like meditation, influence emotions and can be consciously designed, as seen in stationery or company logos.

While energy fields naturally exist on any land, their quality can be significantly improved. In Indian Vastu Shastra, this "alchemy of space" is achieved through astrological calculations (Jyotish). Texts like Vishwakarma Prakash detail how to select an auspicious time for laying a foundation (known as Shilanyas in India). This timing, considering planetary positions, facilitates the formation of optimal energy fields and determines the building's energetic lifespan.

This ancient practice is crucial; neglecting these energy fields can lead to adverse outcomes. For example, some beautiful, well-located buildings in Dubai remain deserted because their natural energy fields have dissipated, highlighting the profound impact of Vastu on a structure's vitality and purpose.

Creating the Creator (Brahma) in Vastu

During construction, after the foundation and plinth are established, a powerful golden-white energy field emerges at the plot's center. Vedic seers, through deep meditation, perceived this field, recognizing its potential to manifest all life forms and processes. This central energy,

termed Param Tattva, Param Purush, or Brahma in scriptures, is the very first to develop.

The strength of this "Brahma" energy field varies—it can be powerful, moderate, weak, or even non-existent. If it fails to develop, construction may cease, often due to the land's inherent qualities. This central energy is considered responsible for the evolution of the universe, hence the concept of "Brahmand" (Brahma's egg) and the universe originating from a golden egg.

Development of 4 Devtas in Vastu: Aryama, Viviswan, Mitra, and Bhudhar

As a building's construction progresses and walls reach 5-8 feet, the central golden energy field expands, evolving into four distinct colored energy fields, much like a blossoming flower or ripples in water.

These fields manifest in specific directions:

- **East:** Develops into a dark blue energy field, known as Aryama, the connector.
- **South:** Becomes a white energy field, termed Viviswan or Viviswat, the controller of change.
- **West:** Appears as a silvery-white field, identified as Mitra, the motivator.
- **North:** Transforms into a rust-red (burnt copper) energy field, called Bhudhar, representing manifestation power.

Vedic seers experienced these energy fields not only during construction but also in natural processes like a flower's blooming or a child's birth, where similar energetic expansions occur. They observed these four directional fields as the "four faces of Brahma" (Chaturdik), recognizing directions as crucial reference points for the expansion of these divine energies from the center. Each of these four "Devtas" (energy fields) possesses unique qualities and attributes, forming the basis of the Vastu Purush Mandala.

Bhudhar: The Manifestation Power (North) Located in the North as a coppery-red energy field, Bhudhar (meaning "the one who carries the power of Manifestation") is responsible for bringing the universe and all existence into being. It's the foundational force of manifestation.

Aryama: The Connector (East) The blue energy field in the East, Aryama, supports growth after manifestation and connects entities within the world. This power facilitates companionship and relationships, crucial for the continuation of evolutionary processes. In Vedic texts, Aryama is invoked for connectivity and finding a partner.

Viviswan: The Controller of Change (South) Found in the South as a white energy field, Viviswan (also Viviswat) is the initiator and controller of change. It drives the manifestation process by initiating and shining light on the necessary transformations.

Mitra: The Motivator (West) The silvery-white energy field in the West, Mitra, is the inspirational force that brings all these processes into action. Repeatedly invoked in the Atharvaveda, Mitra is seen as the power that binds and holds the world together, allowing the process of evolution and manifestation to move forward.

Walls

Origin of Eight Devtas and Asuras in Vastu

Vedic seers observed that as building construction progresses and walls are built (with roof casting remaining), energy fields emerge in the diagonal corners or zones: North-East, South-East, South-West, and North-West. This formation resembles a tortoise with extending legs.

Within each of these diagonal directions, two distinct energy fields develop. For instance, in the North-East, a silvery-white energy field appears. If you draw a line from North-East to South-West through the center, one field forms on the northern side of that line, and another on the eastern side.

These paired energy fields are named as follows:

- In the North-East: The field towards the North is called Aapaha, and its adjacent counterpart is Aapahavatsa.
- In the South-East: The Devtas Savita and Savitra are depicted.
- In the South-West: Indra and Jaya emerge.
- In the North-West: The Devta Rudra and the Asura Rajyakshama are present.

These specific energy formations are fundamental to understanding the subtle forces at play in a Vastu-compliant structure.

Aapaha - Healing Booster and Aapahavatsa - Carrier (North-East)

Aapaha – Healing Booster: Located in the North-East, Aapaha is associated with healing, immunity boosting, and overcoming fears and challenges. Atharvaveda identifies Aapaha as a deity of ailment control, bringing a driving force to humans and being the life (prana) of water streams. Meditating here is said to improve immunity and connect one to higher states of consciousness (Vigyanmaya and Anandmaya Kosha). An imbalance in this zone can destroy healing power.

Aapahavatsa – **Carrier:** Positioned on the eastern side of the North-East, Aapahavatsa is considered the son of Aapaha. He carries medicinal elements to diseased points in the body and transfers insights from the intuitive mind (Vigyanmaya Kosha) to the conscious mind (Manomaya Kosha). Essentially, if Aapaha brings ideas, Aapahavatsa carries them to practical application, making worship or meditation in this field beneficial.

Savita - Igniter and Savitra - Pusher (South-East)

Savita – Igniter: This copper-red energy field in the South-East is responsible for igniting, initiating, and stimulating action (karma). Often synonymous with Surya (Sun), Savita removes ominous symptoms, activates powers through cleansing or friction, fosters connections with

influential people, and provides support and money. It also bestows the power of meditation and offers solutions to problems, granting determination and willpower when balanced. The presence of Ganesh ji is very beneficial here.

Savitra – Pusher: Savitra, a white-colored energy field found with Savita, is considered a powerful entity, even a demon with vast resources, who governs desires and grants strength and nourishment. Vedas state that Savitra keeps the Earth intact in space and bestows the determination for steady meditation and the power to grant luxuries. The Gayatri Mantra originated from Savitra, who provides the strength to move forward in life through earned virtues. Shree Yantra is also beneficial in this zone.

Indra - Protector and Jaya - Winning Tool (South-West)

Indra – Protector (E4): This very dark brown-red (sometimes green) energy field in the South-West is primarily a protector and guardian of wealth. In Vedas, Indra is considered the primary deity for safeguarding money and also associated with the medicine of conception. Therefore, Vastu recommends the South-West for labor rooms, as Indra's powers are believed to stabilize pregnancy and grant strength and longevity. Atharvaveda supports its role in safe delivery and securing valuables. Balancing this zone, along with Varun and Varna, enhances powerful contacts, luxury, and financial gains. An office table here can lead to top positions. An Ashoka Pillar in a balanced zone provides governmentrelated benefits. Conversely, a toilet here can lead to lack of recognition and social disrespect. Bedrooms here foster powerful connections, and living rooms are beneficial. Sleeping here can alter temperament and choices, leading to a desire to associate with the best in society. While orange color is positive here, black (representing Saturn) has shown negative effects. This zone influences family stability, basic growth, and thought processes.

Jaya – Winning Tool: The silvery-white energy field on the diagonal axis in the South-West is Jaya (sometimes Jayendra). Jaya is symbolic of

Indra's weapon (Vajra) and all infallible tools for victory. As construction progresses, this power develops into the ability to impart skill and expertise. Vastu recommends this direction for storing tools, books, and objects related to one's skills. In any field, one's skill is the "Jaya" that ensures victory. A Vastu-dosha here can impair one's ability to effectively use their skills. Jaya channels the thought processes of Indra into manifestation.

Rudra - Channeliser and Rajyakshama - Holder (North-West)

Rudra – **Channeliser:** Mentioned in Rig-Veda as cunning and a head of thieves, Rudra also possesses a unique method of treatment. It is the power that makes water streams flow on earth and maintains the flow of activities in life. Historically, this direction was used for storing food grains (new crop sustaining life). In modern contexts, it's recommended for keeping ready-to-sale goods (stock), as their consumption maintains industrial flow. Rudra signifies that which causes weeping, detoxification, and emotions. Later, in 'Shatpath-Brahman', Rudra is associated with Lord Shiva, possibly due to Shiva's role in making the Ganga flow. Rudra facilitates channelizing support, maintaining day-to-day activities without interruption, influences emotional balance, and fosters the flow of ideas, aiding in completing work with ease.

Rajyakshama - Holder (North-West) and the Dynamic of Prakriti & Purush

Rajyakshama – Holder: This red-colored energy field, co-existing with Rudra in the North-West, is an attendant of Rudra and the "Lord of all roots." Rajyakshama embodies the power that holds foundations together, strengthens them, and maintains stability, literally binding walls. It also has the ability to still the mind. If this zone's energy becomes wrathful, it can lead to extreme mental instability. Crucially, this energy temporarily ceases the Universal Mind, allowing the initiation of creation; without this cessation, new life and creation are not possible. Thus, Rajyakshama is the power that maintains this creative pause and holds the new structures within which life manifests, initiating the world's creation.

At this stage, the space, still open to the sky, divides energetically: the South-Eastern side acts as Prakriti (Female), and the North-Western side acts as Purush (Male). These are initially inactive elements taking their places for creation. However, once activities begin in the completed building, this alignment shifts: Prakriti moves to the Purush side, and Purush to the Prakriti side. This change becomes permanent once all roofs are cast and construction is complete, signifying the building's purpose. Symbolically, this state represents the Vastu Purush lying prostrate, with his right (Pingala/Surya) nadi on the South-Eastern side and his left (Ida/Chandra) nadi on the North-Western side. When imbalanced, support received may not last.

Roof

Origin of Sixteen Devtas and Asuras: The Vastu Purush Conception

Upon the casting of a building's roof, four additional energy fields manifest in each diagonal direction. This configuration gives rise to the conception of the Vastu Purush, visualized by Vedic seers as an embodied figure with a head in the North-East, elbows and knees in the South-East and North-West, and feet in the South-West. Different Devtas inhabit these energy fields.

Aditi - Peace, Diti - Vision, Shikhi - Yogi, Parjanya - Insights (North-East)

In the North-East (Ishaan Koan), when the first roof is cast, four specific energy fields develop: two golden-yellow, one red, and another golden-yellow.

Aditi (N7) - Peace: This golden-yellow energy field is also known as Vishwadevi. Atharvaveda describes it as the force that sustains the entire world, providing boundless peace, serenity, and security. Aditi helps maintain integrity and perfection, often termed "Mother Earth," bestowing the power of "milk mixed with honey." It's the power of self-connectivity.

Key Points:

- Offers the power to overcome all obstacles.
- Imbalance leads to restlessness, nervousness, fear of the unknown, and feeling directionless, causing overall life imbalance.
- Provides the platform for Diti, Shikhi, and Parjanya.
- Bestows the power to receive solutions from Universal Consciousness for difficult situations.
- Mother-like field.
- If extended, the person constantly seeks gurus for problems.

Diti (N8) - Vision (North-East)

Diti, a golden-yellow energy field adjacent to Aditi in the North-East, is considered the mother of demons in Vedas. It grants expressive capability, wider vision, and liberal thinking, allowing one to see life's real truth and nature's actual form. When balanced, it provides mental clarity, purpose, and enables achievement without blindly following traditions. Children born in such a building can innately say "no."

Key Points:

- Broad-mindedness, far-sightedness.
- Impacts at a very deep level, removes duality when balanced.
- Gives the power to say "NO."
- Imbalance leads to a confused mind, inability to visualize aspects, and difficulty making decisions; people may not follow traditions/ rules.
- An entrance here can foster spirituality and female dominance in important roles.

Shikhi (E1) - Yogi (North-East)

Shikhi, the red energy field East of Diti in the North-East, signifies a "pointed flame" or a ray of light, symbolizing the power to project

thoughts and influence the world with ideas. This deep-rooted thought energy paves the way for new creations, products, and services – from airplanes to computers and space exploration. It is considered the "Third Eye of Shiva," the power to conceive any idea.

Key Points:

- Power to conceive any idea.
- Heavy objects here cause imbalance.
- · Can lead to eyesight issues.
- Office gate here can cause electricity-related problems.
- Entrance here brings fire, accidents, and losses.
- A kitchen here causes anger, frustration, and mental disturbance.
- A store here leads to a blocked mindset.
- A toilet can be associated with mental defects.
- Sitting here for long periods can cause disinterestedness in life.

Parjanya (E2) - Insights (North-East)

Parjanya, a golden-yellow energy field further East in the North-East, is associated with flora generation and considered the "husband of the Earth," satiating it like rainwater to produce growth and fruits. Meditating here brings wisdom and insights from the Universal Mind to the intuitive mind (Vigyanmaya Kosha). It grants fertility in cows and women and is responsible for the development of psycho-medicines.

Key Points:

- Best place to meditate, gives insights.
- Suitable for flora and fauna.
- Can lead to more female births and affect females of the home more strongly, making them bolder and dominating.
- A toilet here can result in much effort with no returns and women's fertility issues.

- A washing machine here can cause conception issues for females.
- A dustbin can cause cysts.
- A kitchen here leads to inadequate returns.
- A mother-child photo improves their relationship.
- Flower bouquets and fruit baskets bring good results and abundance.
- An entrance here can also lead to increased expenditure.

Bhrisha - Gravity (South-East)

Bhrisha (E7) is the yellow-colored energy field in the South-East, symbolizing gravity and the power to bring forth new things through friction or churning, similar to how butter is extracted from curd. This energy is essential for correct and timely execution of actions. If weak in a building, it can lead to either excessive overthinking, delaying outcomes, or hasty, unplanned execution, resulting in undesirable results. Vastu suggests activities involving churning here to optimally utilize its power.

- This field brings things out by rubbing.
- A weak Bhrisha can cause excessive thinking, disturbing results.
- You can balance this zone by placing a mixer-grinder here.
- A "cut" in this zone can hinder decision-making.
- While white color hasn't shown negative effects here, blue color can lead to significant problems.
- This zone is associated with Kama Deva, the energy that creates desires.
- The presence of sewerage or metallic art/showpieces here gives unfavorable results.
- A sewing machine in this area can cause BP fluctuations and anxiety.
- If an elderly couple sleeps here, the wife might experience continuous illness.
- If your thinking or analysis isn't clear, examine this field.

- A boss sitting here might become overly strict, potentially causing future issues.
- Placing a Kamdhenu here is considered beneficial.

Antariksh (Akash) - Inner Space (South-East)

Akash (E8), the blue-colored energy field next to Bhrisha in the South-East, represents inner space, the vital void between Earth and Heaven that sustains life. When people feel "suffocated" or lack "space," they're often referring to this Antariksh. This crucial space enables the mind's evolution and provides the necessary physical and mental support for Bhrisha's power to manifest. Just as a plant needs room to grow, or a car occupies space, a building needs this energetic allowance; without it, manifestation isn't possible.

- This field represents the space between Earth and Heaven.
- It's like the "oxygen" needed for anything to happen; manifestation is possible only through Akash.
- If things feel "stuck," such as payments or marriage, check this zone for imbalance.
- A door in this zone can cause financial losses.
- Keeping objects here can lead to them being recognized and appreciated.
- A weak Antariksh zone increases the chances of theft.
- Placing a red bulb here is considered good.
- An imbalance can lead to aggression and body rashes.
- Copper is beneficial for balancing this zone.
- As a field associated with Venus, an imbalance here can affect females more than males.
- A "cut" in this field may result in the elder son being away from home and not integrated with the family.
- A store in this zone can adversely affect happy events in life.

Anil - Uplifter (South-East)

Anil (S1), the blue-colored energy field in the South-East, is the deity of air (Vayu). While Antariksh provides the space for manifestation, Anil is the power that elevates or lifts things within that space. It initiates processes and enables upward movement, like lifting a building or fire. Anil bestows the ability to vigorously move forward in life, even amidst difficulties.

- This field is linked to wind energy.
- If a project isn't starting, check this energy field.
- A door here can negatively affect the elder son.
- Disturbances in this energy may reduce semen count, impacting childbirth.
- Sleeping here might cause restlessness in females.
- The presence of yellow color here can indicate a severe cash crunch.

Pusha - Strength (South-East)

Pusha (S2) is the red-colored energy field in the South-East, signifying nourishment, strength, and promotion. Vedas mention Pusha alongside Indra for blocking enemies, and Vastu recommends this zone for keeping ghee and other nourishing items. Pusha also safeguards journeys and is invoked for recovering lost money. Alongside other deities, Pusha helps select a bridegroom. As the primary protector of buildings, Pusha imparts strength and nourishment to life.

- This zone is nourishing, like a mother.
- It's the best place to keep ghee.
- It safeguards everything, including money; check here if payments are blocked.
- Acts as fuel to continue endeavors.
- A red mat here can help recover blocked money.
- For unsatisfactory fetal growth, place a red mat and ghee here.

- Imbalance can cause family bonding issues.
- Family photos here strengthen family ties.
- Blue color indicates a weakened body.
- Imbalance can lead to children not being self-sufficient or individuals working under others.
- A toilet here can negatively affect a child's growth.
- Keeping a Fevicol tube or a Hanuman Ji photo can improve family bonding and strengthen this zone.

Bhringraj - Discriminator (South-West)

Bhringraj (S7) is the blue-colored energy field in the South-West, representing the power of discrimination and wisdom. It enables one to discern and retain what is essential while discarding the unnecessary, much like the body extracting nutrients from food and eliminating waste. When this power is weak in a building, it can lead to increased expenditure, unsuccessful efforts, and a person wasting time and energy on useless pursuits. Vastu Shastra considers this an ideal location for a toilet, as it facilitates a balanced and smooth disposal process at physical, energy, and mental levels.

- Imparts discriminatory power, helping decide what to keep or remove in life.
- Aids in controlling abortions and miscarriages.
- Provides the wisdom to assess things properly.
- A toilet in this zone is excellent.
- Placing a bed here can result in wasted efforts.
- If this zone is extended, it can lead to more female births in the family.
- It's advised to spend 20 minutes here to release useless thoughts and things.
- An entrance here can cause a total waste of efforts.

- If someone is indecisive ("what to do or not to do"), check this energy field.
- Spending too much time here can make the mind rigid.

Mrigah - Curiosity (South-West)

Mrigah (S8) is the golden-yellow energy field adjacent to Bhringraj in the South-West. "Mri" signifies craving or seeking, highlighting Mrigah's role in generating curiosity and a desire to search and investigate, which is fundamental to life. This Devta is described as being moved by a craving, similar to a deer seeking a smell originating from its own navel. In Vastu, Mrigah bestows the power to develop skills, cultivate a seeking nature, and gain detailed knowledge through practice. Historically, this area was used as a bedroom for common people to optimize this power, aiding those who worked with their hands to improve their craft.

- Generates curiosity.
- Imparts the ability to grasp the essence of things.
- Encourages continuous searching to satisfy curiosity.
- Helps decode the secret of skills.
- Enhances skills and proficiencies to optimal levels.
- This is a suitable place to keep a study table and tools.
- An eagle symbol here can provide foresight, detailing, and a broader vision.
- A toilet here diminishes learning and thinking capabilities.
- Fire in this zone can hamper the power to learn new things.

Pitra - Ancestor (South-West)

Pitra (W1) is the red-colored energy field in the South-West, representing ancestors. This field provides all the means for your happiness and sustenance, granting safety, happiness, and the capacity to donate. It's invoked for the birth of male children and welcoming a new bride, fostering family love and bonding. The attributes of Nairitya Koan in Vastu relate directly to Pitra's power.

- Responsible for childbirth and marriage.
- Promotes family bonding, love, and understanding.
- Imbalance leads to continuous life struggles and feelings of disturbance.
- A toilet here causes instability in life and everyday problems.
- Sleeping here can make a person overly critical and perfectionistic, potentially causing constant tension with family.
- A kitchen here leads to digestion issues, particularly for males.
- · Sewerage causes serious health problems.
- Avoid keeping tools here; an Aloe Vera plant can cause piles.
- Placing a family photo with yellow light is highly beneficial for strengthening this zone.

Dauwarik - Door Keeper (South-West)

Dauwarik (W2) is the red-colored energy field found West of Pitra in the South-West. Possessing infinite knowledge (Agam Shastra), Dauwarik is referred to as the door keeper or filter. This Asura, despite being a demon, is a genius embodying heritage and traditional knowledge. Dauwarik's power helps individuals progress step-by-step in knowledge, filtering out unwanted thoughts and subjects. It decides what knowledge should be absorbed and enhances memory in the subconscious mind.

For children's excellent studies, Dauwarik's power must be balanced in a building. If weak, children may struggle to retain learned information and forget during exams. When balanced, Dauwarik bestows the power of discrimination, enabling a person to evaluate the benefits of expending time, attention, money, and energy, thereby increasing savings by controlling wasteful expenditure at both physical and mental levels.

- Decides what enters and what is omitted from life, acting as a filter.
- Responsible for stepwise knowledge and the power of discretion/ discrimination.

- If someone complains of "total wastage of efforts," examine this zone along with Bhringraj.
- Nandi remedy is considered best here.
- A weak zone can lead to insecure relationships.
- A piggy bank is associated with savings here.
- A bed here makes one mindful and cautious, improving understanding.
- A weak zone can cause inability to use or save money.
- Imbalances here can lead to wasting money on useless products.
- Helps students gauge what to study and its importance.

Shosha - Dryer (North-West)

In the North-West, a blue-colored energy field called Shosha (W7) develops. Shosha, considered a demon in Vedas, is the power that dries things up. As an attendant of Rudra (who causes weeping and water flow), Shosha completes the process of weeping (detoxification) by drying up tears, providing relief from depression or intense emotions. It helps one move past negative experiences.

- If this zone is imbalanced, residents may feel low due to negative experiences and mental breakdowns; balancing it aids self-support.
- Enhances the ability to communicate thoughts, share feelings, and clear one's heart to feel light.
- Can be associated with thyroid problems.
- A "cut" in this zone can cause depression and inability to express emotions.
- A shoe-rack and dustbin can be kept here.

Papyakshma - Addictor (North-West)

Papyakshma (W8) is a yellow-colored energy field next to Shosha in the North-West, considered a demon. While it's associated with diseases, alcoholism, guilt, and mental weakening, it also grants the capacity

for saving. From a yogic perspective, Papyakshma controls negative energies like accumulated guilt and miseries that cause blockages in life. Prolonged exposure to this energy field can foster a negative attitude, an obsession with finding others' mistakes, social disconnection, and a propensity for alcohol or drug abuse to combat loneliness. Vastu suggests a designated "weeping place" in this zone to balance its power, controlling the negative forces that weaken the mind.

- Causes disease, weak mind, and negative behavior.
- Residents may struggle to control their thoughts and speak negatively.
- An entrance here is considered detrimental and can lead to addiction.

Rogha - Weakener/Supporter (North-West)

Rogha (N1) is a red-colored energy field in the North-West. While it can weaken strength, it also acts as a supporter and destroyer of diseases, providing aid during tough times. Rogha's power is comparable to an inverter: it continuously consumes and stores energy, then immediately releases it when needed. In life, as we invest resources (money, time, relationships), a balanced Rogha ensures immediate access to money and support when required.

- Drains energies and can cause fever.
- When balanced, it destroys diseases and provides the ability to handle tough times.
- An entrance here can cause "death-like pain" or severe distress.
- If balanced, it makes a person energetic and supportive.
- A toilet here can result in a failure to receive support.
- An imbalanced zone can significantly disturb the mother of the family.
- Keeping grey stones or similar photos here provides stability.
- If a boss isn't supportive, placing one's photo with the boss here is suggested.

- Family photos are also recommended here.
- Brass elements are good here.
- An entrance here can metaphorically "shatter one's reputation."

Naga - Craving (North-West)

Naga (N2) is another red-colored energy field in the North-West, considered a serpentine demon (Sarp Asur) and the giver of emotional enjoyments. Naga grants the power to control sexual tendencies (Mooladhar-related) and derive pleasure from them, generating lust. Mythologically, Naga is Kaamdeva's weapon, binding individuals with sexual desire. It's also linked to Varun's "Nagpash" power, used to bind. In Vedas, Naga is invoked as a weapon to bind enemies in lower human sensual activities, yet paradoxically, this demon is invoked as a Dev.

- Generates lust and desire.
- An entrance here can cause jealousy.
- Imbalance can attract people who are jealous.
- Products placed here will attract people.
- A mirror here can greatly increase materialistic desires.
- An ironing table or shoe-rack is not recommended here.
- If a dustbin is kept here, residents may be less liked by others and people may not want to associate with them.
- Placing a Lakshmi Ji Silver Murti here is excellent for financial gains.

These 45 energy fields, known by various names, develop throughout the Vastu Purush Mandal as construction progresses. After the first roof is cast, all remaining Devtas continue to take their places, leading to the building's completion. The text concludes by indicating that the next discussion will delve into the attributes and significance of these sixteen Devtas in greater detail and their role in the world's creation.

Completion of Structure

Origin of Sixteen Devtas and Asuras

Upon the completion of a building's civil structure, before services like electrical and plumbing are installed, sixteen new energy fields emerge. A transparent energy field forms in each cardinal direction (East, South, West, North), subsequently dividing into four distinct parts within each direction.

Jayant - Success, Mahendra - Administrator, Surya - Controller, Satya - Goodwill (East)

In the East, this field divides into two golden-yellow parts, one burnt-red/coppery-red, and one silvery-white (pearl) part.

Jayant (E3) - Success: This golden-yellow energy field in the East is associated with victory and success in all endeavors. Jayant imparts a sense of triumph and refreshes both body and mind, infusing individuals with enthusiasm to execute new ideas, leading to success. When balanced, occupants remain focused on their goals without being bogged down by trifles, and the home's atmosphere remains cheerful, enhancing social contacts and growth.

- Ensures success in all undertakings and provides goals and enthusiasm for ideas.
- A sword placed here might make one critical and bitter in speech.
- A bedroom here can make a person street-smart.
- A toilet has negative effects on children, making them shy and unable to express themselves well.
- Black color or circles can sometimes have negative effects.
- Wine storage or a bookstore here can benefit social mingling.
- Plants are very good in this zone.
- It teaches "Sam Daam Danda Bheda" (strategic policies).
- An entrance here equips residents for success in the materialistic world, bringing money, profits, and success.

- Living rooms and dining areas are suitable here.
- Impacts the mind, helps with creative solutions, and imparts action and determination.

Mahendra - Administrator (East)

Mahendra (E4) is the next golden-yellow energy field in the East, considered a highly significant deity, after Aapaha and Agni. Primarily, Mahendra is the administrator deity for associating people and fostering the power of association. Originally Indra, he earned the title Mahendra after defeating the demon Vatra. His chariot, moving with the speed of mind, signifies his control over the five senses and his role as the deity of the mind. Mahendra bestows the administrative power to effectively manage and get work done within an organization. When balanced in a building, Mahendra's energy grants connections with high-ranking government officials and administrators, leading to abundance, wealth, and luxuries.

Surya - Controller (East)

Surya (E5), the next deity in the East, has a coppery-red energy field and is considered a primary deity in Rigveda. Symbolically representing the core controller or soul in any system, Surya destroys negative forces residing in darkness. Vedas also describe him as the eye of Varun and Agni, and the lord of eyes, bestowing farsightedness and observational power. In a Yogic sense, becoming an observer and establishing oneself in the soul grants the power of Surya, which runs the world. When Surya's power is balanced in a building, the occupants gain fame and recognition in society.

- Guardian Power and Controller of Systems.
- Increases farsightedness and observation power, leading to better control.
- Chief of the nine planets, depicted by a seven-horse chariot.
- Balances energy and strength of residents.
- A door here can cause short temperament and aggressive behavior.

- If a boss sits here, they might feel a lack of control over the work environment.
- Placing a poster or Murti of Lord Vishnu here is highly beneficial.
- A copper sun is advisable when the overall fire element is weak, even if the South zone is also weak. Brass sun is generally beneficial.
- A weak Surya field can make the men of the house very mellow and soft.
- A kitchen here can bring aggression.
- Orange color yields positive results.
- If this field is weak, things at home or office may lack systematic organization.
- Imbalances can be associated with a lack of sex drive in men.
- If the owner complains that "nobody listens to me," check this field.
- Temple placement here has shown no negative effects.

Satya - Goodwill (East)

Satya (E6), the silvery-white energy field next to Surya in the East, is associated with goodwill and status. Though no "Satya" Dev is explicitly named in Vedic literature, a deity named "Satyen" is described as responsible for establishing authenticity, credibility, and reputation. Satya is considered a supporter of Surya, characterized by sharpness, emotional intensity, and an undeterred nature. When this energy field weakens in a building, residents may lose credibility, trustworthiness, and reputation. Satya grants the ability for proper thinking and analysis, forming the basis for successful task execution and maintaining a person's goodwill and commitments in society.

- Creator of goodwill and credibility, with attributes close to Surya.
- Imparts the power of right thinking and encourages fulfilling commitments, especially marriage.
- Imbalance can lead to a person moving from one partner to another, and others failing to fulfill commitments towards them.

- A mirror here can be dangerous.
- Green plants are acceptable, but blue color has shown negative effects, causing people not to fulfill promises.

Vitatha - Pretension, Grihakshat - Ceasor, Varna - Order, Gandharva - Preserver (South)

After the East, the transparent energy field in the South segregates into four different colors.

Vithatha (S3) - Pretension: Starting from the South-East, the first energy field in the South becomes a transparent, highly shining silver color. In Vedic language, this is Vitatha, related to the unreal world, falsehood, and pretension. Vitatha embodies the mentality of showing off, projecting a false image, and living a masked life – literally "moving opposite (vi) to facts (tath)." Vastu Shastra emphasizes using even "bad" forces positively; positive pretension (e.g., affirming one's inner capability) can yield positive results. Misusing Vitatha's power, however, leads to disrepute if the pretension lacks depth and authenticity.

- Associated with pretension, untruth, and falsehood.
- If extended, family members may become self-important.
- When balanced, it fosters very good self-confidence.
- Imbalance leads to mere show-off and false commitments.
- A door here can encourage unethical means.
- People sleeping here may become very bossy.
- Toilets here can make people feel their capabilities are limited and create self-doubt.
- A door here can bring prosperity and abundance.
- Balanced, it provides self-confidence.

Grihakshat - Ceasor (South)

Grihakshat (S4) is the golden-yellow energy field next to Vitatha in the South. While not explicitly found as a named Devta in Vedas,

its meaning is derived from "Griha" (ceasing the mind) and "kshat" (supporter). Grihakshat is considered a deity of the building, embodying the power to control and bind the mind within boundaries. A building, as a "Griha," defines the limits of your mind, and Grihakshat governs this control.

Furthermore, Grihakshat acts as a supporter by defining the boundaries or domain of your helpers, ensuring your consciousness extends effectively for specific tasks.

- Represents "Mann ka dayara" (mind's boundaries) and aids selfcontrol.
- Crucial for achieving success in desires.
- Imbalance can lead to forgetting responsibilities, casual attitudes, and a lack of peace.
- A door here is beneficial, leading residents to enjoy life.
- Blue color may cause court cases or misunderstandings, conflicts, commitment failures, and bad company.
- A large water body here can result in undisciplined students.
- Children sleeping here may exhibit better discipline and good behavior.
- If imbalanced, people may not listen to advice.



Chapter 17

This helix effectively corrects defects like low or cut corners, toilets, kitchens, pillars, staircases, master bedrooms, anti-elements/colors, and electricity-induced stress. It can be placed in sets of 3 or 9, vertically or horizontally, or concealed within walls.



Brass Helix

The Brass Helix is specifically designed to activate and balance the Space/Wind element in the North-West, the zone of support and banking. It's an excellent remedy for defects like roof slope towards NW, higher flooring, toilets, cut or extended zones, and open space in the North-West. Install 3, 9, or multiples, concealed in the floor/ceiling, or hung/placed in ready structures.



Iron Helix

The Iron Helix, designed for the West direction, activates and balances the Space/Wind element, a zone associated with gains and profits. It's a key remedy for West corner defects like:

- 1. Toilet
- 2. Cut or Extended zone

Install 3 or 9, or multiples based on area or expert advice. It can be concealed in floors/ceilings, or hung/placed in ready structures.



Copper Helix



A compelling example of topography's effect is Mr. Jimmy Carter's 1970s visit to China. Suffering from acute appendicitis, he received local acupuncture treatment. Upon re-examination in the U.S., his appendix was found perfectly fine, eliminating the need for surgery. Impressed, he sent a research team to explore oriental knowledge.

Virtually all life's problems can be addressed with Vastu Shastra. Vastu is a gift from Mother Nature, enabling us to create an environment conducive to fulfilling our desires. While it's impossible to list every Vastu offering, understanding its core principles provides a glimpse into its potential for daily life.

Symbols serve as a vital medium for communication between human beings' inner selves and the mysterious forces of Nature. Aparajit, the first sculptor, immortalized the invisible by creating "symbol-sculptures." Symbols are powerful, possessing their own language and effects, having guided human evolution since ancient times. They are integral to the conscious and subconscious mind, with linguistics even suggesting language developed from them. The human subconscious mind solely understands the "language of symbols."

The subconscious mind expands into two domains: the human inner mind and a building's inner space. The human mind is programmed by its living environment—the space within a building.

Before applying Vastu remedies, the first three steps of the 4-step Vastu process must be completed in your building. Caution is advised when using symbols, as this forms the fourth and final step, providing the "finishing touch" for desired manifestation. Only after thorough understanding and practical



observations should one decide on a course of action for life's problems. Avoid haste; nature works at its own pace but is profoundly effective. If multiple issues need addressing, tackle them one by one.

The judicious use of Vastu symbols and remedies, discussed hereafter, can completely transform your life.

Performing Nabhi Viddhi

Nabhi Viddhi is a Vastu practice designed to enhance the energetic core of a space. Here's how to perform it:

- 1. **Prepare the Plate:** Get a 6x6 inch copper plate. On this plate, carefully place the gemstones specified in the provided table (from Serial No. 2 to 10 and Serial No. 16).
- 2. **Secure Gemstones:** To keep the gemstones in place, either glue them onto the plate or wrap the entire plate with cello tape.
- 3. **Dig the Pit:** At the center (Brahmasthan) of your property, dig a pit approximately 1 to 1.5 feet deep.
- 4. Place the Plate: Carefully lower the copper plate into this pit.
- 5. **Optional Rituals:** If you wish, you can perform Pujas or chant Mantras at this stage.
- 6. **Backfill and Finish:** Fill the pit with sand over the plate. Afterward, you can proceed with fixing marble or tiles for your flooring.

Important Considerations:

- Ideal Time: The best time to perform Nabhi Viddhi is between 6-7
 AM.
- **Day:** It can be performed on any day. However, if you're including gold with the Nabhi Viddhi, Sunday is the preferred day.
- **Gemstone Quantity:** The gemstone quantities listed in the table are for an area of around 1500 sqft. Adjust the quantity based on your plot's size.

Beneficial Pyramid Placements:

- North-North-West: Improves sex life.
- North: Enhances money-attracting energy.
- North-North-East: Promotes health.
- North-East: Imparts clarity of mind.

A pyramid can reduce negativity and amplify energy in imbalanced zones where an activity's purpose clashes with the zone's inherent energy.

Important Cautions: Always place pyramids on the floor and align them along the north-south axis. Never stick them on walls, doors, or ceilings, as this can be dangerous.

While powerful alone, pyramids offer even greater benefits when combined with other Vastu remedies:

- Government Work: Place an Ashoka Pillar in the North-West (table) and a pyramid in the North (floor).
- New Opportunities: Pyramid in North (floor) and a brass lion in North-North-East.
- **Fulfill Desires:** Pyramid in West (floor) and a Kamdhenu cow in East-South-East.
- Middle Eastern Business: Pyramid in North (floor) and a camel in West.
- Career Start: Pyramid in North-East (floor) and fresh flowers in a vase in North.
- **Health & Protection:** Pyramid in North-North-East (floor) and a yellow earthen vase in South-South-West.

Placing a pyramid in the zones associated with sex enhances satisfaction.

Frequent Ask Questions

Q1. If the South South West (SSW) is weak or extended, can a yellow vase be used for balancing it, or is it only for weak zonal strength?

Ans. Yes, a yellow vase, representing the Earth element, can be used for balancing a weak or extended SSW zone.

Q2. Does the Vastu Purush Mandal only occupy the central portion of a square plot?

Ans. No, the Vastu Purush Mandal can be proportionally drawn on a rectangular plot, with varying distances between lines on the perpendicular sides.

Q3. If the West-North-West (WNW) is cut or weak in a building, what kind of symptoms will it create?

Ans. A weak or cut WNW zone can lead to feelings of depression and low moods.

Q4. What is the ideal location for an overhead tank (OHT)? South or South West? Does it affect residents, as it's not occupied space?

Ans. OHTs can be placed in the South or South West zones. Their effects typically don't appear if placed more than three floors above the residents' floor. However, symptoms should still be checked, and remedies applied if necessary.

Q5. If property papers are kept in the West, does the file color matter? If so, what color?

Ans. White or yellow colored files are suitable for property papers in the West.

Q6. A toilet in the North & North-North-East (NNE) is a strict no. If one already exists and causes problems, should the toilet seat be completely removed or is sealing it fine?

Ans. Removing the toilet seat completely is ideal, but sealing it will also be effective.

Q7. Since Kuber Ji is to be placed in the North, can his sculpture be made of Brass?

Ans. Yes, a Kuber Ji sculpture can be made of brass, as the main programming is by the sculpture's form, not solely its material.

Q8. If business projects always take too long (e.g., 1 year takes 2), leading to fines, which zones are responsible?

Ans. The East-South-East (ESE) zone is the primary reason for project delays, though other zones can also contribute.

Q9. What do clockwise stairs in the North-East zone bring?

Ans. Clockwise stairs in the North-East zone reduce clarity of mind and hinder the conception of new ideas.

Q10. Where should a Mandir (temple) be kept in the house?

Ans. The North-East zone, being for clarity and meditation, is ideal for a Mandir. Deities should face West, and you should face East or North-East.

Q11. Kidney problem: Which zone and what are the tips?

Ans. Kidney problems are linked to an imbalance in the North-North-East (NNE) Vastu zone. Avoid placing inverters, dustbins, toilets, and storage there.

Q12. Can we keep a cashbox in the South-East?

Ans. Yes, a cashbox can be kept in the South-East zone.

Q13. In which zone should a garbage can, broom, etc., be placed?

Ans. Ideally, garbage cans and brooms should be placed in the South-South-West (SSW) Vastu zone.

Q14. As the West direction is for gains, does a chessboard here cause ups and downs, as chess signifies it?

Ans. No, when applied in a balanced West zone, a chessboard yields only positive results.

Q15. Please tell me the color and material of a pyramid?

Ans. Pyramids should always be made of plastic or wood, and can be wooden or white in color.

Q16. Can I keep a wooden or crystal type pyramid on a table in the North-North-East? Please mention the size also.

Ans. Pyramids should always be placed on the floor only. Wooden is acceptable, but avoid crystal pyramids. The base size should be a minimum of 4 inches.

Q17. In the North of my house is the toilet and bathroom. Do you suggest keeping the pyramid in the toilet? I am facing too much financial problems, is it because of the toilet? What should I do? Should I put some yellow stripes. Is it OK to keep the pyramid in the bedroom?

Ans. A toilet in the North is a major reason for financial problems. Keeping a pyramid in (or near) the toilet in that zone will help. Yellow stripes are not the primary solution here. It is generally okay to keep a pyramid in the bedroom, but its placement should follow Vastu guidelines.

Q18. Where to keep the cash counter in shops and what should be done to cater to the element part (if there is an imbalance) in this zone?

Ans. Generally, a cash box can be kept in the North zone. However, placement depends on available space and the shop's facing. Standard remedies for elemental balance cannot be prescribed without a complete Vastu analysis of the shop.

Q19. It is well mentioned in the Vastu zones that the South-East (SE) is the cash and liquidity zone. So, is it good if I keep the cash counters in this zone for cash transactions?

Ans. Yes, a cash counter can be made in the South-East zone.

Q20. My flat has an East entrance and a North entrance. Which door should I use?

Ans. Both East and North entrances are perfectly fine if they are in beneficial locations. Once confirmed, you can use either door based on convenience.

Q21. Where should the toilet be placed?

Ans. Toilets can be placed in the South-South-West (SSW) Vastu zone.

Q22. Which color should we use for the walls in the South?

Ans. You can paint off-white color in the South zone.

Q23. What is the other option for an overhead water tank except the West Vastu zone? Is the North zone, OK?

Ans. The North zone is not suitable for an overhead water tank. The South-West (SW) zone is a suitable alternative.

Q24. Could you please tell me which is the ideal place/direction for Red Color in a house?

Ans. The ideal directions for red color in a house are the South East, South-South-East (SSE), and South zones.

Q25. When should a Vastu remedy be applied? Is there a particular time or an auspicious day or date that must be kept in mind when applying Vastu remedies?

Ans. No, you do not need to wait for an auspicious moment to apply a Vastu remedy. Auspicious times are for starting something new. Remedies can be applied at any convenient time or day, as their purpose is to correct imbalances and restore harmony.

Q26. Are Vastu remedies objects of worship?

Ans. Vastu remedies are not objects of worship, but they should be cared for and kept in clean areas. They are akin to decorative objects used to enhance a space's aesthetic appeal.

Q27. If a Vastu remedy breaks, is it considered a bad omen? Should a broken remedy be submerged in a river or a water body?

Ans. A breaking Vastu remedy is not a bad omen; often, it's considered a good omen symbolizing the departure of negative vibrations. Do not submerge broken remedies in water bodies as it causes harm. The traditional method is to bury them in an unused area of land. If not possible, dispose of them carefully, ensuring they are not mixed with garbage.

Q28. Is it necessary to consult a certified Vastu Expert when applying remedies?

Ans. For complex Vastu-doshas (defects), consulting a certified Vastu expert is advisable. An expert can assess whether problems are Vasturelated, their extent, and prioritize the application of remedies.

Q29. What should I do with a remedy after getting the desired results?

Ans. Vastu remedies can be left in place even after desired results are achieved, as they continue to have beneficial effects. If you wish to remove them, store them carefully along the West wall or gift them to friends and loved ones.

Q30. Can a Vastu remedy be gifted? Are there any norms for giving or receiving Vastu remedies?

Ans. Vastu remedies have been gifted for centuries, benefiting both giver and receiver. However, this does not apply to statues or pictures of Devis and Devtas intended for worship; giving and receiving these is a harmful practice.
